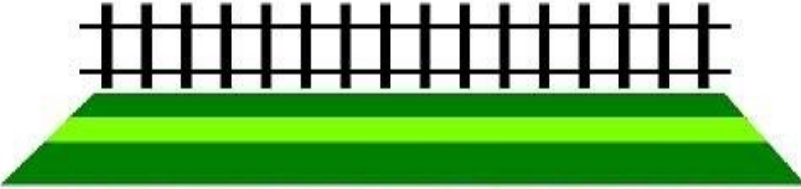

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## From the Editor/Clerk

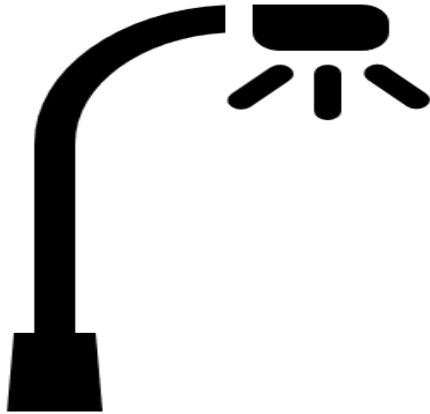

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## **Parish Council Chairman's Report**

Hello everyone

I'm delighted to report that the New Year has started really well, as of our January meeting we now have a full complement of Parish Councillors. Councillor Julie Massen was co-opted onto the Council during our November meeting and Councillor Ben Taylor-Wright was co-opted during our January meeting. On a more sombre note, Margaret Bunkall, a well-known and respected Councillor who served on the Parish Council for a considerable number of years, passed away during January. Our thoughts and sympathy go out to Margaret's family and friends.

### **Progress reports**

Our hope is that 2025 will see a number of projects completed during this year, below is a list of the current activities.

#### **Highways, Road Safety and Public Rights of Way**

You will have noticed that the SAM2 speed monitoring unit was absent during part of last year. The unit has now been repaired and is back collecting data from various locations within the villages. Councillor Paul Bridges has volunteered to take on the task of moving the system around and downloading the data collected. The latest summary of the data can be found on the Parish Council's website under the tab "Speed Awareness"

The application for the "White Gates" to be installed on Eau Brink Road and Lynn Road has been submitted and accepted, we await a response as to the outcome. If the application is approved, then we would expect work to start on the project during April.

The Parish Council are aware of the overgrown nature of the trod between Wiggenhall St. Germans and Wiggenhall St. Mary. We are working with the stakeholders involved to establish a sustainable solution to keep the trod clear for pedestrians at all times, in the meantime the Council has agreed to, if necessary, employ a contractor to resolve the issue.

#### **Play Park Project**

The Play Park Steering Group have done some sterling work, a proposal of the different types of equipment has been assessed and a final selection of the individual items made. Quotations have been finalised and a preferred supplier identified allowing us to submit an application for the funding for the project. Thanks go to the Memorial Hall Committee for their support and assistance in overcoming an issue with a lease, and thanks also to the Crown and Anchor and Save Our Pub group for donations and support. If all goes to plan, we would expect to start work on this project during the summer.

#### **Environment and Biodiversity**

Councillors has been busy preparing a small trial area for the Wild Flower Project on the entrance to Edinburgh Place. The ground was made ready and the sample of seed supplied sown in accordance with the suppliers instructions. Unfortunately, a few days after the sowing, the water main in the area sprang a leak and flooded the trial plot. It is hoped this is only a minor setback and that the seeds have not been washed away, only time will tell.

The Wiggenhall Woodland Creation Scheme would appear to have stalled due to a difficulty with the funding of the project however Norfolk County Council are hopeful the project will start sometime during the end of this year which is the ideal time for planting saplings. The Parish Council continue to support and offer local knowledge to the team which has resulted in a number of minor changes to the scheme.

Moles would appear to be a considerable problem this year and the Council have engaged the services of a professional mole control expert to help resolve the issue both at the Memorial Hall Playing Field and the Leonard Towler Football Field, this would appear to be an ongoing problem and the situation will be monitored as to how to proceed for the coming months.

#### **Change of meeting dates**

Due to clashes with various holidays and availabilities the Council have changed the meeting dates for March, May and July.

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

The Annual Parish Meeting is held to allow Parishioners to suggest projects and items, within the Parish Council's remit, which would benefit the community and should be focused on.

Items that came up at the November meeting included:

**New telephone system:** some people reported having trouble using the new menu system when calling in on a mobile phone. The Centre undertook to look into this, and from recent practical experience the problem seems to have been resolved.

**NHS App:** unfortunately, any problems with the NHS App are beyond the control of the Medical Centre.

**Walks for Health:** a trial of these social walks had been organised by Sue Calver during the summer of 2024, and had proved to be worth pursuing.

It is now hoped to start the walks again during the months of May, June and July 2025, and further information and details of dates and times will be posted on the Centre's web pages and on the PPG noticeboard in the Surgery waiting room.

**Changes:** There has been a change of Officers of the PPG since Judith Leigh moved away from the village last year, and the new team is

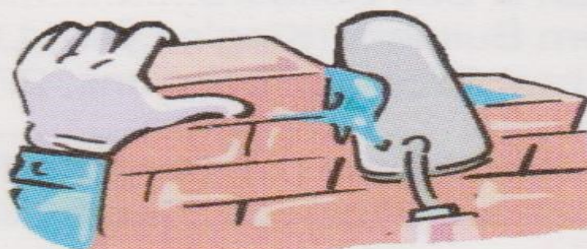

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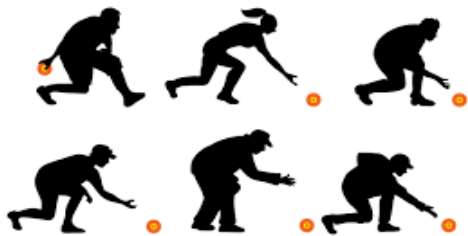
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# Wiggenhall Bowls Club

The Bowls Club held its regular annual Christmas Bingo and raffle in December 2024. Many thanks to all the local businesses who donated prizes for the raffle. It's difficult to single out special prizes for recognition but we were delighted to receive a splendid Christmas food hamper from Caley Farms, a large miniature tractor and trailer from Ben Burgess, and 2 'hampers' of mixed cans of drink from Sainsburys. Other donated prizes that went to appreciative homes were from Palm Paper, Roy Thorne & Son, Sargeants the Butchers, Smiths the Bakers, St Marys B&B, and Tesco. We would like to thank all these local businesses for their support, and let them know how much we appreciate their generosity.

The Bingo evening was well attended, and people seemed to enjoy the event. Although perhaps not as many people came as in some years, the event was very successful, and made just over £500 for the Club.

Over the winter the Club has applied for a grant to purchase extra storage for the equipment held at the green. We are also starting on a campaign to dispose of equipment that is no longer in regular use, and hope that the two initiatives will give us rather more space around the clubhouse.

In the coming year the Club will be facing some changes, as the Chair, Secretary and Treasurer have all decided to have a rest, and we are looking for replacements for these 3 key roles.

At the time of writing the Club has not yet held its pre-season meeting for the outdoor bowls, when plans for the coming season are finalised. The usual date for opening the green is around the Easter weekend, but the confirmed date will be advertised around the village and in the local press, nearer the time. During the summer we shall be holding at least one Open Day, when anyone interested is welcome to come along, meet Club members and have a go at bowling. We have a variety of sizes of bowls for you to try, and only ask that you wear flat shoes to protect the grass on the bowling green.

We are hoping to continue our fairly regular Saturday afternoon sessions over the summer, when club members can get some practice in, and anyone interested can come along and meet our members and have a bowl in an extremely relaxed setting. Tea or coffee and biscuits are offered, with cold drinks if the weather turns hot. 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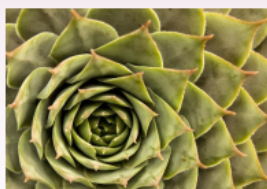
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## Watlington Medical Centre Patient Participation Group (PPG)

## Wiggenhall St. Germans Church News

When you come to the church, or walk through the churchyard, you will see that the notice board has been changed. Much of the wood on the old notice board needed replacing and we were given a notice board in much better condition that has been 're-purposed' as they say now, for the church. We are very grateful for the new notice board and for all the hard work that has been carried out on it.

The church is open daily from 9.30 a.m. to dusk for anyone who would like to come in for prayer, or just a time of quiet, and visitors who want to look at this historic Grade 1 Listed Building. There is a brief guide about the church on the table as you enter the door.

Every morning, except Sunday, there is a short Morning Prayer, when the sick and recently departed are prayed for by name. The usual pattern of our Sunday Services is a more informal Family Service at 10 a.m. on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month and a Morning Praise Service on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday with a Holy Communion Service on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday, all of which begin at 9.30 a.m. All Sunday Services include activities for children and refreshments are served after every service.

On Ash Wednesday (5<sup>th</sup> March) Morning Prayer will also include 'Ashing' for anyone who wishes it. There will be a Mothering Sunday service at 9.30 a.m. on 30<sup>th</sup> March when posies will be available for the children (of any age) to give to their mothers. Palm Sunday (13<sup>th</sup> April) will be marked by a procession from the Memorial Hall to the church for the 9.30 am service and the giving of Palm Crosses. Our Easter services begin with a service on Good Friday from 12 noon to 3 pm. Everyone is welcome to come and leave at any point during this service. We will be celebrating the resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday with a service of Holy Communion at 9.30 a.m. Details of all the services will be on the church notice boards in the village and in the church.

We are looking forward to events planned in the next few months of a Pancake Party on 4<sup>th</sup> March from 10 am to 12 noon at the home of Ken and Judith Baker at Wiggenhall St. Mary the Virgin. We are looking forward to, once again, enjoying Ken's delicious pancakes. There will be a Kids Easter Fest, to be held in the Memorial Hall around the time of the school Easter holidays, more details nearer the time. Plans are underway to mark the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of VE Day on 8<sup>th</sup> May, with further details to follow. We shall be holding our annual flower festival in the church on 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> June, but there will not be an 'Open Gardens' this year. Throughout the year there is a flower arranging group meet in the church on the second Monday of each month at 2.30 pm. if you would like to try your hand at flower arranging. For further details please come along to the group or call Marion Coleman on KL 617494. Every Friday, except Good Friday and Christmas, there is a Coffee Morning in the church from 9.45 a.m. to 11 a.m. Everyone is very welcome to come along for a drink and a chat. There is also a monthly 'Walk & Talk', a leisurely walk around the village, followed by coffee. Full details of all events and services are in the church monthly newsletter, available at the back of the church or by e-mail on request. 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## Help and Advice

The article below lists a collection of bodies and organisations to help us all through the difficult times ahead this winter. Some organisations listed are just useful to know about and we might find them helpful at any time - in a time of need. The list is random but covers a wide range subjects:

**Food Bank**—The Trussell Trust Foodbank situated in Downham Market provides emergency food and compassionate dignified support to those in crisis. Food vouchers can be issued by health visitors, staff at schools, social workers, priests, medical staff. A voucher means people can receive a food bank parcel of three days' nutritionally balanced food from their local food bank. They also receive additional support like debt advice, benefits guidance and mental health support. (Food banks rely on the local community to support people in crisis and seek donations of tinned food. See the article on food banks elsewhere in this magazine)

**The Norfolk Swift Response—0344 800 8020** The Norfolk Swift Response Team is a 24 hour service that provides help, support and reassurance. If you have an urgent, unplanned need at home but you don't need emergency services e.g. if your partner or carer is suddenly admitted to hospital, the Swift Response team can assist you with getting up and washing and dressing. Or if you have a fall and can't get up but not seriously injured, the team can bring special lifting equipment to help you with safe lifting. The Swifts help older people, people with physical illness or disabilities, people with learning difficulties and people with mental health problems. This is a free service for those living in Norfolk.

**NB. For this an Alarm Pendant would be very useful, which can be obtained from Careline.**

**Careline Community Service— 01553 616200** For pendants that can detect falls and can automatically call through to the monitoring centre. Pendants that can be worn in the shower and the bath.

**LILY- 01553 616200** Service that combats loneliness and social isolation in adults of all ages. Contact them also for Care and Repair Service and also Handy Person Service e.g. grab rails, key safe etc

**Citizens Advice - 0800 144 8848** Will give help and advice on Benefits, energy bills, cost of living, Debt and money, Housing.

**Well Being Service - 0300 123 1503.** [www.wellbeingnands.co.uk/norfolk](http://www.wellbeingnands.co.uk/norfolk)

Visit your library in Downham Market for 'Warm Packs' and hot drinks.

**Watlington Medical Centre - 01553 810253** for your flu and covid booster vaccines.

**Discretionary Housing Payment** - For the over 65's. Means that the council will be able to top up Housing Benefit or Universal Credit Payments if a resident has a shortfall in their rent and their income is less than their allowed expenses.

**Council Tax - 01553 616200.** The Council is reminding residents to get in touch asap if they are experiencing difficulties in paying their council tax bill.

**GOV.UK** - Help for households, Family support - Tax free child care, 30 hours free childcare, 15 hours free childcare, child benefit, claim back childcare costs, free school meals, holiday activities and food programme, national breakfast clubs, household support fund, claim healthy start vouchers, help with maternity costs. ## Community oil buying

**Thinking Fuel** is a community oil buying scheme offered by Community Action Norfolk which is a charity working across Norfolk.

Following an advertising campaign last year they now have nearly 550 members in West Norfolk. The more members they have, the more members can save when buying oil and we understand that people signed up for **Thinking Fuel** are currently saving around 20p per litre on oil purchases compared to some other commercial providers. It's free to join and there is no obligation to buy. As the borough council we don't recommend one supplier over another but we are sharing this information to give borough residents the opportunity to think about the options available to them.
